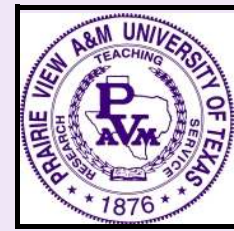

Bexar County Urban Impacts



The monumental reasons for CEP's continuing efforts is the **growth of urban CEP Extension programs in Bexar County**. The accomplishments and successes clientele have demonstrated within Extension programs are recognized through outcomes and program impacts. Clientele who participated in Extension programs have displayed knowledge and skills acquired through effective and innovative programming.

The following program current impacts reveal knowledge and skills gained by urban clientele:

- ! 1,040 junior high school and high school students participating in the T-TEEM program learned the value of money through basic business and money management skills, and a step by step business plan to create their own group businesses.
- ! An approximate total of \$57,000 in revenue was generated from the five T-TEEM school stores, and the 175 T-TEEM youth businesses over a term of five years.
- ! Participants in the T-TEEM program were made aware of entrepreneurship as a viable career option.
- ! As a result of the T-TEEM program, based on T-TEEM teacher observations, the students interest in school, and their reading, writing, math skills and self-confidence were enhanced.
- ! 654 youth in the TLC 4-H program, (ages 14-19), developed, improved and strengthened their leadership and life skills in the areas of team-building, leadership, cultural diversity, self-esteem, social skills, and drama and the fine arts.
- ! Through the TLC 4-H program, 14 TLC 4-H Clubs were implemented and developed in Bexar County.
- ! 600 at risk, urban youth in targeted schools, churches, community centers and youth agencies gained knowledge and skills in wildlife and natural resources, and their interest in conservation was strengthened during their stay at the H.S. Estelle 4-H & Youth Camp in Huntsville, Texas.
- ! 2000 youth and adults prevented diet-related illnesses by improving and increasing their dietary habits and physical activities through the FF:NEWS program.
- ! Approximately \$500 annually is contributed by Communities in Schools to the FF:NEWS program for food and supplies to conduct nutrition programs in Bexar County.
- ! 250 at risk, urban youth increased knowledge in advanced educational opportunities while exploring careers in Agriculture and Family and Consumer Sciences at the annual Career Awareness and Youth Leadership Laboratory conducted on the campus of Prairie View A&M University.
- ! A total of 19 youth and adults provided leadership, guidance and assistance to the advisory boards conducted by the FCS and 4-H agents in support of urban county Extension programming.
- ! Within the past five years, \$310,000 in grants and in-kind contributions were procured by the 4-H agent in support of local county 4-H programs.
