

4-H College Scholarship Opportunities

EVENT:

Texas 4-H Foundation Scholarships: The Texas 4-H Foundation opportunity are awarded each year to applicants based on their 4-H experience, academic record and financial need (for scholarships for which it is a prescribed criterion). The Opportunity Scholarship program is conducted in coordination with the Texas 4-H and Youth Programs and the Cooperative Extension Program and Texas Cooperative Extension. All applications must be submitted through the applicant’s County Extension Office. Approximately 150 scholarships or more are awarded each year ranging in amounts of \$500 to \$15,000. No scholarship recipient will receive less than \$1,500. In order to apply the applicant must be a 4-Her and a Texas resident, and scheduled to graduate form a Texas high school during this school year in order to apply.

Eligibility:

These scholarships are made available in January, each year to graduating senior 4-Hers, and are expected to be submitted to your county Extension office in March. You can retrieve a copy of the scholarship from your local county Extension office.

EVENT:

San Antonio Livestock Exposition, Inc. • Cooperative Extension Program Scholarships: The San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo and the Cooperative Extension Program (CEP) award up to two-four year scholarships in the amount of \$12,000. These scholarships are made available to outstanding minority students that are seeking a Bachelor of Science degree at Prairie View A&M University in any area recognized by the San Antonio Live Stock Exposition, and who participate in 4-H and Youth Development Programs in the State of Texas.

Eligibility:

This scholarship opportunity is made available graduating senior 4-Hers in January each year and are expected to be submitted to your county extension office in March. You can retrieve a copy of this form from your local county Extension office.

4-H National and State Events Scholarship Opportunities

EVENT:

National 4-H Conference: 4-Hers learn to become more active citizens and partners in their communities. Youth 15-19 years of age can attend. Round table discussions about youth issues, at local, state and county government are held at the conference. 4-Hers make plans to address these in their own communities and their recommendations help guide the Secretary of Agriculture’s decisions on the development of youth programs nationally. Registration for this five day event per participant is \$1,400. However, the 2 \$1, 400 scholarships are provided to senior 4-Hers. This event is held in Chevy Chase Maryland, at the National 4-H Youth Center mid March each year.

Eligibility:

Two scholarships opportunities are made available to interested senior 4-Hers in October each year and are expected to be submitted to your county Extension office in December. EVENT:

Texas 4-H Congress: 4-Hers share projects and activities with state government representatives and hear and learn about the legislative process. It is a four-day mock legislative experience for 4-H members’ ages 15 to 18. During this time 4-Hers assume roles of senators, representatives, lobbyists, press corps and special interest groups t gain first hand understanding of how the legislative process works. Bills concerning youth issues are written and sponsored by 4-H members, and if passed it is presented to the Governor for his review. At the same time 4-Hers also educate law makers about the 4-H programs in their communities. The cost to attend this event is \$150 per participant. The Cooperative Extension Program pays for \$90 of the \$150 leaving the participant with only a \$60 registration fee. CEP provides 10 \$90 scholarships each year to attend this event.

Eligibility:

Five \$90 scholarships are made available to senior 4-Hers interested in attending this event. The forms are provided in March each year and are expected in the county Extension office in May.

EVENT:

National 4-H Congress: This is as flagship event where 4-Hers participate in leadership and learn new ideas for community service projects. During the five-day event, 4-Hers participate in educational programs and club events in Atlanta. They have a chance to learn what other 4-H Clubs are doing in their counties through community action activities from across the nation. They return to their counties with the responsibility of sharing this information, and implementing these ideas and activities with fellow local county 4-Hers. Youth 15 and older can participate in this event. The cost per participant is \$1,500.

Eligibility:

4-Hers 15 and older can apply for a scholarship to attend this event. 2 scholarships are made available in March each year and are expected to be submitted to your local county extension office in May.
