Dog Project Trainings

We will be offering basic dog obedience classes for 4-H members interested in the dog project. Classes will be held on Monday evenings at 6:30 pm at Bark of Southtown, 1032 S. St. Mary's Street, San Antonio, TX 78210. Classes will begin on **Monday, September 17th** at 6:30 pm; bring your dog with you. Future meetings will be Sept. 24th, Oct. 1st, Oct. 8th, Oct. 15th, Oct. 22nd and Oct. 29th.

This will begin as a basic obedience class and then progress into advanced obedience, rally, conformation and showmanship - with the hope that Bexar County will be showing their dogs at the State Dog Show next July! Your dog does not have to be a "show dog" to participate! In addition to training your dog, you will also be learning about dog care and ownership. Space is **very** limited, so pre-registration is a must! Call Laura at 210-326-9406 to sign up. You must provide proof of vaccinations for each dog participating. Vaccines required are Rabies, DHLPP, and Bordatella (kennel cough) This is for the safety of your pet and others.

Classes are free of charge for enrolled 4-H members. However, a donation of a large bag of premium dog food is being requested to help feed dogs being trained for wounded warriors. One bag of dog food per 4-H member please.

All Competitive Events Need Eligibility Forms

All competitive events that you will represent 4-Hwill require academic eligibility forms to be completed by 4-H members. Even if the events take place on weekends, UIL rules state, you must be academically eligible to participate in extracurricular activities. Depending on the event, we will either email the form to you, have it available it on our website or mail it to you. It is your responsibility to follow through and take the form to your school to mark if you are academically eligible to participate in the event. Due date to return the form to our office will be at the top of the form. There is a drop slot in the front door to help you meet deadlines. If you have any questions about eligibility, please contact us.

Re-enrollment in 4-H begins August 16th Participation FEE - \$20 after October 31st \$25.

All members must re-enroll in 4-H.every year. Enrollment will be on line via the 4-H Connect program. If you already have a profile set up on 4-H Connect, all you need to do is update your profile information and select you want to enroll for the new 2012-2013 4-H year. Pay the \$20 fee participation fee by **credit card.** Adult leaders and Clovers Kids are not required to pay the \$20 fee. The fee is \$20 between August 16th, 2012 and October 31st, 2012 or \$25 between November 1st, 2012 and August 31st, 2013 the end of the 4-H year. If you cannot remember your password on 4-H Connect, please call Greg or Pam to reassign you a new password.

Club Charters

Every 4-H club must re-charter each year. Club charter packets were handed out at the two Club Manager trainings. If you could NOT attend the training, we have charter packets available in our office. Charter paperwork is due to our office before **September 28**th. There are two items that the State 4-H Office has asked we include in the charter paperwork, if you have a checking account for your club (if you **do not** have a checking account, these items are not needed). First item....please include a copy of your last bank statement. Second item...complete the attached Budget Planning Form. Please add these two items to your charter when you turn it in. IReminder, we have a drop slot in the front door to assist you in making this dead-line.

"Quality Counts" Verification Required for Major Shows

Starting in 2012, Quality Counts verification will be required for all 4-H members exhibiting livestock (market and/or breeding) at all major livestock shows. The verification process will require all 4-H & FFA exhibitors to pass an online test that measures their knowledge on quality assurance and character education content items. 4-H members will need to have completed and passed the test before the major livestock show's entry deadline (usually the first of November). There is no limit to the number of times you can take the test, as long as you achieve 80%. Please visit this website to complete the verification process: http:// qualitycounts.tamu.edu.
