



## FALL VEGETABLE VARIETIES

The following dates correspond to the optimal time span during which seeds should be directly sown into the fall vegetable garden. If one decides to grow a certain crop which the recommended dates indicate is too late to seed into the garden, then appropriate transplants should be used. These planting dates only insure success if recommended, fast-maturing varieties are used.

**Note:** *The use of transplants could possibly give you another 30 days of extended planting time.*
