TO: District 10 4-H Fashion Show/Fashion Storyboard, Duds to Dazzle and Textile Show
Participants

All Junior, Intermediate and Senior age members are eligible to compete at the District 4-H Fashion Show, Fashion Storyboard, Duds to Dazzle and Textiles Show on Friday, April 29th, at the First Lockhart Baptist Church, 315 W. Prairie Lea St., Lockhart, TX 78644 (map enclosed).

Please read the information below carefully as it directly affects your participation in the District 4-H Contests:

Fashion Show:

1. **All** Junior, Intermediate and Senior age members are eligible to compete at the District 4-H Fashion Show.
2. Registration Procedure: Each participant must register for the District Fashion Show contest on-line using the 4-H Connect Program. \$10 Entry Fee for Fashion Show or Storyboard. If the participant is entering both contests it will be an additional \$5 for the second contest for a total of \$15. \$10 Fee to enter the Textiles Show (can enter all 6 categories with this fee) \$10 Fee Per Team Member for Duds to Dazzle. When selecting form of payment, select Credit Card.
3. There will be two different events on 4-H Connect, "2015-2016 District 10 Fashion Show" and "2015-2016 District 10 Duds to Dazzle." The Fashion Show event will be to register for: Fashion Show, Textiles Show and Storyboard, this will be done by the individual participant. Duds to Dazzle will also be done by the individual participant. Registration on 4-H Connect must be done by **April 11th**.
4. After County Fashion Show, your Fashion Show Information Sheet Form and Score Cards will be returned to you with suggested changes. Check for spelling and grammatical errors! You do not have to make any changes, you can submit the one you have already prepared. REMINDER: If you complete a new form, it will need new signatures before you turn them into the office. **ALL COMPLETED FORMS (Junior, Intermediate and Senior Construction/Buying Information Sheets ARE DUE TO OUR OFFICE BY FRIDAY, APRIL 8TH**.
5. Juniors, Intermediates and Seniors must have a head to toe color photo (not to exceed 4"x6") attached to their information sheet.
6. District Fashion Show registration begins at 8:45 a.m. Contestants orientation begins at 9:30 a.m. Judging begins at 10:00 a.m.
7. Please study the fashion show questions (enclosed) and be prepared.
8. Parents will not be permitted in the judging area.

9. Participants are encouraged to wear their entry to the Fashion show. Classrooms will not be available for participants to change. Bathrooms will be available to change, but contestants must be courteous of those who need to use the facilities.
10. Please respect school property. We will have to pay for any damages that occur.
11. Make a checklist of what you need to take (shoes, belt, earrings, etc.)

No food or drinks will be allowed in the classrooms.

District Fashion Storyboard:

1. **All** Junior, Intermediate and Senior age members are eligible to compete at the District 4-H Fashion Show.
2. Registration Procedure: Each participant must register for the District Fashion Show contest on-line using the 4-H Connect Program. \$10 Entry Fee for Fashion Show or Storyboard. If the participant is entering both contests it will be an additional \$5 for the second contest for a total of \$15. \$10 Fee to enter the Textiles Show (can enter all 6 categories with this fee) \$10 Fee Per Team Member for Duds to Dazzle. When selecting form of payment, select Credit Card.
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4. After County Fashion Show, your Fashion Storyboard and Score Cards will be returned to you with suggested changes. Check for spelling and grammatical errors! You do not have to make any changes, you can submit the one you have already prepared. **District 10 4-H Fashion Storyboard display with label on back of board are due to our office by Monday, April 18th.**

District Textile Show:

1. **All** Junior, Intermediate and Senior age members are eligible to compete at the District 4-H Fashion Show.
2. Each participant must register for the District 4-H Textile Show contests on-line using the 4-H Connect Program. Entry fee is \$10.00 per member, you can enter all 6 categories with this fee. Registration on 4-H Connect must be done by **April 11th**. Select the event “2015-2016 District 10 Fashion Show”. When selecting form of payment, select Credit Card.
3. After County Fashion Show, your Textile Score Cards will be returned to you with suggested changes. Your Textile entry is due to our office by Monday, April 18th

District Duds to Dazzle:

1. **All** Junior, Intermediate and Senior age members are eligible to compete at the District 4-H Fashion Show.
2. Registration Procedure: Each participant must register for the District Fashion Show contest on-line using the 4-H Connect Program. \$10 Entry Fee for Fashion Show or Storyboard. If the participant is entering both contests it will be an additional \$5 for the second contest for a total of \$15. \$10 Fee to

enter the Textiles Show (can enter all 6 categories with this fee) \$10 Fee Per Team Member for Duds to Dazzle. When selecting form of payment, select Credit Card.

3. There will be two different events on 4-H Connect, “2015-2016 District 10 Fashion Show” and “2015-2016 District 10 Duds to Dazzle.” The Fashion Show event will be to register for: Fashion Show, Textiles Show and Storyboard, this will be done by the individual participant. Duds to Dazzle will also be done by the individual participant. Registration on 4-H Connect must be done by April 11th.

District Academic Eligibility Form is enclosed and due to our office by Wednesday, April 20, 2016. Because this is a Friday event you are required to turn in the original eligibility forms, no faxes, no e-mails.

1. Did you enjoy your clothing project this year?
2. What did you learn in your 4-H clothing project?
3. Where will you wear this garment and how does it fit into your wardrobe?
4. What is the fiber content of your garment? It is natural or man-made?
5. How will you care for your garment?
6. Tell us why you selected this garment?
7. Why did you enter your garment in this category?

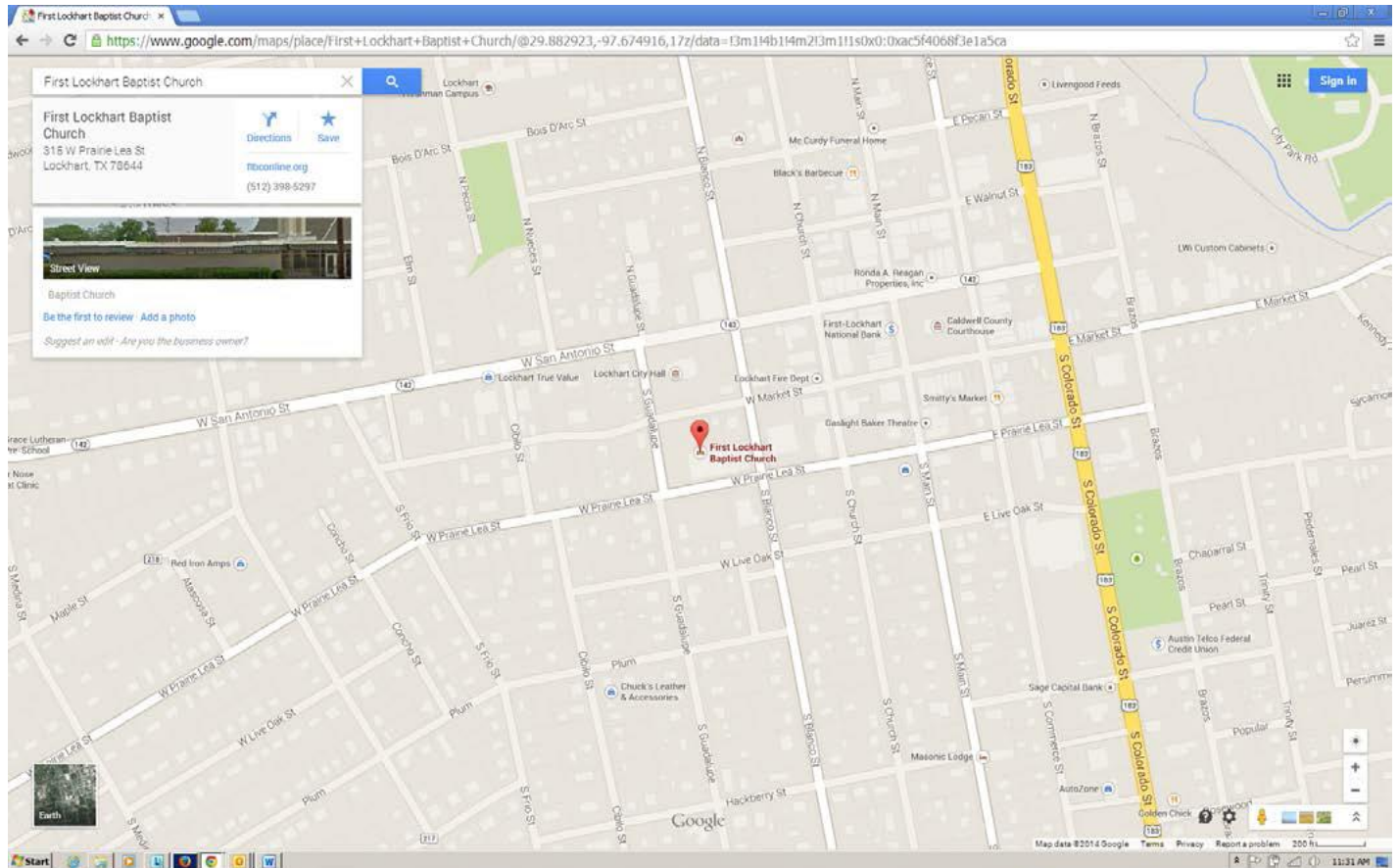
Possible Interview Questions

1. Describe your clothing and textiles project goals. Describe how your project goals guided your project work.
2. What is the fiber content of your garment? Describe two qualities of each fiber.
3. Are the fibers in your garment natural or man-made?
4. Why is this fabric a good choice for your garment? Describe fabric characteristics that make it suitable for the intended use of the garment.
5. How will you care for this garment? Is there any additional cost to consider when caring for this garment?
6. How did you decide which sewing methods to use for seams, hems, etc.?
7. What occasion do you plan on wearing your garment?
8. What did you consider when selecting your accessories? Why were these considerations important to you?
9. What skills did you learn while constructing this garment?
10. How will you use your sewing skills after you graduate from the 4-H program?
11. How does this outfit meet your clothing needs?
12. How often do you plan to use the outfit/accessories? What is your cost per wearing?
13. Do you have a clothing budget? Describe how you allocate your clothing dollar.
14. Why did you choose to construct this garment rather than buy it?
15. Describe your clothing and textiles project activities? What was your favorite activity?
16. How did you connect your clothing and textile project work with community service?
17. What community service activities were you involved with?
18. Talk about why this garment is a good fit for your body type.
19. How does your garment fit in with current fashion trends?
20. Describe how this garment will fit with your current wardrobe.

4-H Fashion Show Seniors – Buying Possible Interview Questions

1. For what occasion did you select this outfit?
2. Tell me how you went about selecting this outfit?
3. What is the fiber content of your garment? Tell me two qualities of each fiber.
4. Are the fibers in your garment natural or man-made?
5. What considerations did you use when you selected this outfit? (fiber, fabric, design, construction)
6. How does this outfit meet your clothing needs?
7. What information does the garment's hangtags give you?
8. Why did you select the particular style, color(s), and/or fabric(s)?
9. Explain how and why the style of this outfit is appropriate for your figure type.
10. Describe what you think makes your outfit fit your personality?
11. Are there any changes you would make to improve the fit?
12. Explain what you considered when you choosing your accessories.
13. How will you care for this garment? Is there any additional cost to consider when caring for this garment?
14. What skills did you learn while shopping for this outfit?
15. What is your "cost per wearing"? (The number of times you actually wear a garment divided by its cost. A formal that is only worn once will have a higher cost per wearing than a pair of jeans that will be worn many, many times.)
16. Do you have a clothing budget? If so, who determines the budget amount?
17. In your comparison shopping, what did you consider the most important thing to look for?
18. As you selected the pieces for this outfit, what did you learn about price and quality?
19. How reasonable was the cost of your outfit in terms of your family's spending plan?
20. Do you have a clothing budget?
21. Describe your clothing and textiles leadership activities? What was your favorite leadership activity?
22. How did you connect your clothing and textile project work with community service?
