COVID-19 Update from Bexar 4-H

Howdy 4-H Family,

As I'm sure you're all aware, our nation and state are currently navigating difficult waters regarding the spread of COVID-19 (<u>https://texashelp.tamu.edu/coronavirus-information-resources/</u>).We are taking guidance at this time from our agency, local government, and federal government on how best to advise our groups to mitigate the probabilities of infection and further spread of the virus. **Please read the following recommendations regarding public gatherings/social distancing, and best hygiene practices.** We know you all have been made aware of this information, but we'd like to emphasize the importance of these practices so we can hopefully return to a normal state of operation in the near future.

- The following actions are being taken regarding educational programs and face to face meetings:

 All AgriLife face-to-face meetings will be cancelled *through May 4th* at the earliest. This status will be
- NEW
 - reviewed based on the statewide public health disaster declaration made by the Governor. All 4-H Programming will be suspended until TBD, 2020.



b. Starting Monday March 23, 2020, *our physical office will be closed*, and we will implement a telecommuting solution to minimize as much person to person contact as possible for a two week period. After this two week period, we will revisit the telecommuting solution. We can be reached during normal office hours at 210-631-0400. *As of June 23rd, the County Office was CLOSED AGAIN due to the recent spike in COVID-19 cases in Bexar County. All Extension personnel are telecommuting.

CURRENT POLICY ON 4-H CLUB MEETINGS: Regular Face-to-Face meetings cannot be conducted by our staff/volunteers until we have officially begun our re-opening process AND sent out an official notice that you may begin meeting. This process will be done in 3 phases, and each phase will have specifications regarding meeting capacity and restrictions. I know many of your groups are eager to begin meeting, but these guidelines and directives must be followed by our agency. PLEASE DO NOT run the risk of meeting, because any meetings being held face-to-face are NOT considered 4-H sanctioned events at this time

2. The following CDC information relates to how COVID-19 is spread:

- The virus is thought to spread mainly from person-to-person.
 - Between people who are in close contact with one another (within about 6 feet).
 - \circ Through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs or sneezes.

Some spread might be possible before people show symptoms; there have been reports of this occurring with this new coronavirus, but this is not thought to be the main way the virus spreads.

• Spread from contact with contaminated surfaces or objects:

It may be possible that a person can get COVID-19 by touching a surface or object that has the virus on it and then touching their own mouth, nose, or possibly their eyes, but this is not thought to be the main way the virus spreads.

3. The following CDC information relates to how to mitigate infection of COVID-19:

CDC always recommends everyday preventive actions to help prevent the spread of respiratory diseases, including:

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick and stay home if you are feeling sick.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol. Always wash hands with soap and water if hands are visibly dirty.

Few Reminders:

• All Market Lambs, Market Goats, Breeding Sheep, Wether Dams, Breeding Goats, and Wether Does will use the same RFID validation tag.

All Market Lambs, Market Goats, Breeding Sheep, Wether Dams, Breeding Goats, and Wether Does **will be on the same form.**

- Market Lambs and Goats may be <u>family validated</u>, however Breeding Sheep and Goats must <u>only have</u> <u>one exhibitor per animal</u> (this includes wether dams and does).
- Exhibitors with breeding sheep and goats will **need to have registration papers** available at validation.
- Wether Dams & Wether Does are breeding animals and must be entered on the Breeding section of the validation form.

LAMBS AND GOATS VALIDATED FOR THE STATE FAIR OF TEXAS MUST BE REVALIDATED FOR THE 2020-2021 SPRING/WINTER MAJOR SHOWS. STATE FAIR OF TEXAS LAMB AND GOAT VALIDATION TAGS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AT THE MAJOR SHOWS.

Texas Lamb Breeders Association (TLBA) and Texas Goat Breeders Association (TGBA) tag numbers MUST be in the animal's ear and be recorded on the validation form at validation. **NO TLBA or TGBA tag numbers will be added to the validation forms after the forms are submitted to the Sheep and Goat Validation of Texas program.** Market lambs and wether does must have a TLBA tag to be eligible to compete in the San Angelo Stock Show.

2020-2021 Stock Show Updates

State Fair of Texas: Be sure to check the show's website at <u>https://www.bigtex.com</u> for the latest information. The State Fair of Texas has released a revised schedule for junior livestock exhibitors.

Heart of Texas Fair

- Updated show schedule found online at http://www.hotfair.com
- Purebred and crossbred division in the breeding gilt show. Purebreds must be state validated, crossbreds do not have to be validated.
- Lambs will be classified with the newly revised classification guidelines.

Fort Worth

- Any exhibitor who makes a material misrepresentation regarding entries subjects themselves to being barred from all further competition.
- Junior Heifer Show a representative from each county 4-H or FFA chapter must obtain a packet from the superintendent's office containing their groups show numbers for their entries. Exhibitor's are responsible for verifying their show number/entry to the superintendent's office.
- Minimum weight for steers is 1,000 pounds.

San Antonio

- There will be a \$10,000 scholarship awarded to the Champion Dorper Market Lamb in 2021.
- Junior heifers will be split into two groups, Group 1: Feb. 15-17; Group 2: Feb. 18-19. Group 1 will consist of all American breeds and ONLY Simmentals entered in the Superbowl. Group 2 will consist of all British and Continental breeds.
- Market barrow maximum weight will increase to 290. Weight range will be 240-290.
- Premium pass (expedited arrival service at SCP) will be available for the junior market barrow show.

Texas Elite Showcase: There will be a white crossbred breed added.

San Angelo

- There will no longer be a sale option for market steers. Any steer placing 1st or 2nd will be required to sell.
- Plans are in place to offer a sheep and goat skill-a-thon.
- Crossbred gilts can only show in the Stars Gilt Show. The Stars Gilt Show has a sale associated with it.
- All market lambs must be TLBA bred and have the TLBA tag number recorded on the validation form.

Houston

- Open/Junior Breeding Sheep March 1-3
- Junior Gilt Show March 4-5
- Plans are to adjust market barrow weights to be more in line with industry standards. More information will be forthcoming.

Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease Update & Updated Local Show Practices

Information: If you raise or exhibit rabbits, please reference the RHDV2 Situational update <u>HERE</u>. Due to the current concerns on Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease, we asked the Texas A&M College of Veterinary Science to assist us in developing recommended validation and show practices for the rabbit project. We know there are ongoing concerns on how to protect youth rabbit projects while preparing to participate in upcoming shows and events. These <u>GUIDELINES</u> were developed so that you could share them with your local shows as you prepare for validation.

2020-2021 Texas 4-H Chartering Information – Charters due ASAP

Information: I know it's crazy to think about... but the 2020-2021 4-H year is right on our heels! Therefore, the chartering information is now released so clubs can get ready for new year. Please view and download the <u>Chartering Packet</u> which includes various support pieces. The documents are also located online at: <u>https://texas4-h.tamu.edu/management/</u>. You may also join us for Club Manager training on July 7th at 10am or 6:30pm on <u>WebEx</u>. Items to note include:

- 2020-2021 <u>Texas 4-H Chartering Instructions</u> Contains all instructions and resources. *Please note the timeline! In order for your club to be ACTIVE by September 1, 2020, you must turn your packet in by July 1, 2020*
- 2020-2021 Charter Agreement.
- Download: <u>Sample Bylaws</u>: The *sample bylaws are developed to serve as a guide* for clubs/groups to use in bylaw development and/or revision. Chartered clubs/groups have flexibility with their bylaws; however, the items in bold in the sample set are required to be in the all bylaws. When you review the sample bylaws, you will notice *LESS bolded/required items*. This does not mean you have to change your bylaws, as long as they meet the minimum requirements, which they should if they were in compliance last year. Club/group bylaws may also not conflict with the Texas 4-H Rules and Guidelines and/or the charter agreement.
- 2019-2020 Financial Review Form: Bank statements uploaded as part of the chartering packet should not include copies of canceled checks. This is for security of the club/group account(s).
- Charter Worksheet for Club/Group Managers to complete and use to fill out information in 4-H CONNECT This form is simply a worksheet and *should not be uploaded*.

Below are highlights for the 2020-2021 Chartering Process:

- All 4-H clubs/groups must be chartered by February 26, 2021 for the 2020-2021 4-H year. This ensures that all community 4-H clubs will be active for at least six months in order to provide a quality 4-H experience. For SPIN clubs or other special situations related to the formation of a club/group after February 26th, a request for late submission can be made to the Texas 4-H Office.
- 4-H Clubs/Groups which are not going to be active for the 2020-2021 4-H year due to lack of leadership or membership, but would like to retain their EIN are required to charter and request an "INACTIVE" status. This will allow the club/group to remain under Texas 4-H Inc. for one 4-H year. If the club does not become active after one year of inactive status, the club will permanently be removed from Texas 4-H Inc's IRS list.


