COVID-19 Update from Bexar 4-H

Howdy 4-H Family,

As I'm sure you're all aware, our nation and state are currently navigating difficult waters regarding the spread of COVID-19 (<u>https://texashelp.tamu.edu/coronavirus-information-resources/</u>).We are taking guidance at this time from our agency, local government, and federal government on how best to advise our groups to mitigate the probabilities of infection and further spread of the virus. **Please read the following recommendations regarding public gatherings/social distancing, and best hygiene practices.** We know you all have been made aware of this information, but we'd like to emphasize the importance of these practices so we can hopefully return to a normal state of operation in the near future.

1. The following actions are being taken regarding educational programs and face to face meetings:

- a. All AgriLife face-to-face meetings have been cancelled at this time. This status will be reviewed based on the statewide public health disaster declaration made by the Governor.
- b. Currently, we are implementing a telecommuting solution to minimize as much person to person contact as possible. We can be reached during normal office hours at 210-631-0400. *Presently we are open at a 25% staff capacity and will meet with clientele via appointment ONLY to minimize foot traffic in the office.
 CURRENT POLICY ON 4-H CLUB MEETINGS: Regular Face-to-Face meetings can resume after on/after Tuesday September 8, 2020. Meeting Guidelines/Checklist for Club Managers must be adhered to, and a WAIVER for participating members is highly encouraged to keep on file. We know this is a unprecedented situation, please be sure to communicate with the County Extension Office if you have questions regarding the new Guidelines/Procedures.

2. The following CDC information relates to how COVID-19 is spread:

- The virus is thought to spread mainly from person-to-person.
 - Between people who are in close contact with one another (within about 6 feet).
 - Through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs or sneezes.

Some spread might be possible before people show symptoms; there have been reports of this occurring with this new coronavirus, but this is not thought to be the main way the virus spreads.

• Spread from contact with contaminated surfaces or objects:

It may be possible that a person can get COVID-19 by touching a surface or object that has the virus on it and then touching their own mouth, nose, or possibly their eyes, but this is not thought to be the main way the virus spreads.

3. The following CDC information relates to how to mitigate infection of COVID-19:

CDC always recommends everyday preventive actions to help prevent the spread of respiratory diseases, including:

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick and stay home if you are feeling sick.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol. Always wash hands with soap and water if hands are visibly dirty.

We do NOT require that you have a waiver form for every club meeting, however when members sign it at each meeting, they must acknowledge that they are agreeing to the previously signed WAIVER FORM. However, if you are holding a non-club meeting (separate project meeting, special event/training) you must acquire your own copy of the Screening Letter/Waiver. Again, we wish everyone a safe, healthy and successful year!

Information: If you will be showing a Market Barrow or Registered Breeding Gilt at the majors and you did not order a tag, you will need to purchase a Late State Validation Tag. Please fill out and return this FORM (Please write child's name where it reads "Exhibitor") & payment to the Extension office ASAP. Late tags are \$30 each and in limited supply! Once your tags are ordered you will need to attend at least ONE validation event with all of your animals so they can be tagged and processed before the major shows (Be sure to reference the premium list for the shows in which you plan to participate as several are requiring registered gilts to be state validated. San Antonio is also requiring registration papers to be uploaded on -line). If you do not attend the physical validation event you will not be able to show your animal.

BCJLS Rabbit Validation PROCEDURES & GUIDELINES:

The Bexar County Rabbit Show is scheduled for Thursday, December 31, 2020, with check-in by 11 AM. Rabbits are dealing with their own pandemic, Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease Virus, stereotype 2 (RHDV2). RHDV2 is considered highly contagious, spreading between domestic and wild rabbits with a very high mortality rate. It entered Texas in the Spring of 2020 and has spread significantly through 10 southwestern states. To minimize the risk of spreading, we are going to a "virtual" validation process of all exhibitors who can. Your meat pen rabbits should have been born about October 22nd, and now be 3 weeks old. If you did not breed your own, you should be receiving your rabbits in about two weeks from your breeder. We are requesting that the Exhibitors ask their breeder/suppliers to tattoo the rabbits before delivery.

Some breeders are going to show reluctance due to a little extra effort on their part, but I would encourage you to push back by requesting their cooperation to minimize the potential of spreading the rabbit virus for the good of the rabbit community that they are an essential part of. Also, remember this is being done to protect the health of the rabbits you are buying.

If you cannot get the breeder or an alternative person to tattoo, or if other special circumstances apply, BCJLS will tattoo on an appointment-only basis. The exhibitor will still need to take photos and submit their validation by e-mail the same as the "virtual" validations.

Validation will consist of sending an e-mail from the family to <u>rabbits@bcjls.com</u> with some basic information:

Exhibitor Name(s) Club(s) Breed(s) Number of rabbits to be validated

and photos of:

• **the exhibitor(s) and rabbits as a group** (do your best to get all rabbits in a photo, but if you are validating a large group just show the cages of rabbits).

• **A photo of each ear tattoo that is legible.** You will have to clear the excess ink before the photos are taken. The recommended cleaning for a fresh tattoo is by applying a very thin coat of petroleum jelly (aka Vaseline) to seal the ink in the holes and wipe the excess away with a paper towel. Alternatively, once tattoos are about 4 days old, you can wipe with a damp cloth.

Please consolidate all photos into a single e-mail to be sent to <u>rabbits@bcjls.com</u>. We are asking this to be done by December 4, 2020, and please cc yourself to confirm it went out. If you cannot get your rabbits tattooed by other means, please e-mail me at <u>jstondre@yahoo.com</u> by November 29th. We will schedule validations by appointment the week of November 30th. We will ask that you bring your own cleaning supplies.

We understand that change creates stress, but that is not the purpose of this change. We only want to protect your investment in your project. As a consideration, please think about your plan after December 31st. The rabbit virus has spread by unwanted domestic rabbits being released into the wild. Please do your part to control the spread by not releasing rabbits.

Per the BCJLS rules, animal projects (including rabbits) are validated per family, not by the individual participant. I made my best assumptions assigning families based on mailing addresses on the entries. Please let me know if we need to consolidate or divide.



Texas 4-H Dog Show Updates & Validation Information

<u>Information:</u> Texas 4-H Dog Show will be held on July 9-10, 2021 at the Walker County Fairgrounds in Huntsville, Texas. To be eligible for this show, dogs must be validated by January 10, 2021 in 4-H Online. Members are encouraged to validate any dogs they are eligible to show in the event situations change through the year. <u>Linked are detailed written instructions</u>. The state 4-H office has also created video instructions <u>https://youtu.be/3NzoljK9Pco</u> if that is more convenient.

As 4-H members complete their validation, here are some things to keep in mind:

- For purebred dogs (they do not have to be registered, just look purebred) you will select the correct Group and list the breed.
- For mixed breed dogs you will select the Weight Group of the dog and list the dominant breed along with the word "Mix" or list the two breeds if known. (Example: Border Collie Mix or Mastiff/Great Dane.)
- Photos of the left and right side of the dog should be a side view of the whole dog. Get on the dog's level so they do not turn into top views. They should also be clear and light enough we can see all markings and color of the dog.
- <u>None of the previously validated dogs carried over to 4-H Online</u>. Everyone will need to complete the full <u>online validation form and upload photos this year</u>.
