COVID-19 Update from Bexar 4-H

Howdy 4-H Family,

As I'm sure you're all aware, our nation and state are currently navigating difficult waters regarding the spread of COVID-19 (https://texashelp.tamu.edu/coronavirus-information-resources/). We are taking guidance at this time from our agency, local government, and federal government on how best to advise our groups to mitigate the probabilities of infection and further spread of the virus. **Please read the following recommendations regarding public gatherings/social distancing, and best hygiene practices.** We know you all have been made aware of this information, but we'd like to emphasize the importance of these practices so we can hopefully return to a normal state of operation in the near future.

1. The following actions are being taken regarding educational programs and face to face meetings:

- a. All AgriLife face-to-face meetings have been cancelled at this time. This status will be reviewed based on the statewide public health disaster declaration made by the Governor.
- b. Currently, we are implementing a telecommuting solution to minimize as much person to person contact as possible. We can be reached during normal office hours at 210-631-0400. *We will begin 25% staff capacity once the positivity rate reaches 7% for 14 consecutive days. Call our office if you need office assistance. CURRENT POLICY ON 4-H CLUB MEETINGS: Regular Face-to-Face meetings can resume after on/after January 19, 2020. Meeting Guidelines/Checklist for Club Managers must be adhered to, and a WAIVER for participating members is highly encouraged to keep on file. We know this is an unprecedented situation, please be sure to communicate with the County Extension Office if you have questions regarding the new Guidelines/Procedures.

2. The following CDC information relates to how COVID-19 is spread:

- The virus is thought to spread mainly from person-to-person.
 - o Between people who are in close contact with one another (within about 6 feet).
 - o Through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs or sneezes.

Some spread might be possible before people show symptoms; there have been reports of this occurring with this new coronavirus, but this is not thought to be the main way the virus spreads.

• Spread from contact with contaminated surfaces or objects:

It may be possible that a person can get COVID-19 by touching a surface or object that has the virus on it and then touching their own mouth, nose, or possibly their eyes, but this is not thought to be the main way the virus spreads.

3. The following CDC information relates to how to mitigate infection of COVID-19:

CDC always recommends **everyday preventive actions** to help prevent the spread of respiratory diseases, including:

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick and stay home if you are feeling sick.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol. Always wash hands with soap and water if hands are visibly dirty.

Additionally, we have also included a **COVID-19 Screening Letter and Waiver Form** for your use with members. We do NOT require that you have a waiver form for every club meeting, however when members sign it at each meeting, they must acknowledge that they are agreeing to the previously signed WAIVER FORM. However, if you are holding a non-club meeting (separate project meeting, special event/training) you must acquire your own copy of the Screening Letter/Waiver. Again, we wish everyone a safe, healthy and successful year!



- There will be a \$10,000 scholarship awarded to the Champion Dorper Market Lamb in 2021.
- Junior heifers will be split into 2 groups, Group 1: Feb. 15-17; Group 2: Feb. 18-19. Group 1 will consist of all American breeds & ONLY Simmentals entered in Superbowl. Group 2 consists of all British & Continental breeds.
- Market barrow maximum weight will increase to 290. Weight range will be 240-290.
- Premium pass (expedited arrival service at SCP) will be available for the junior market barrow show.

San Angelo - PREMIUM BOOK & ENTRY FORMS RELEASED! Please go HERE for information!

- There will no longer be a sale option for market steers. Any steer placing 1st or 2nd will be required to sell.
- Plans are in place to offer a sheep and goat skill-a-thon.
- Crossbred gilts can only show in the Stars Gilt Show. The Stars Gilt Show has a sale associated with it.
- All market lambs must be TLBA bred and have the TLBA tag number recorded on the validation form.



- Family Health Assessment Form: Each exhibitor family must have a completed Family Health Assessment form completed and turned in at the pen assignment. The driver must have a completed family health assessment form for each exhibitor family with animals on the trailer to be allowed access to unload. - Wildlife & Meats Judging Contest: The Wildlife and Meats Judging Contests are held at the MIR Center, a part of the Angelo State University campus. ALL ATTENDEES- participants, coaches, parents, etc-that will be attending these contests at ASU's MIR center MUST compete special forms for ASU. Please visit the registration page at judgingcard.com, or find the documents. There is a separate form for Minor Participants and Coaches/Parents. Please complete these forms in advance and bring them completed to the contest.
- <u>Heifer Futurity:</u> The Heifer Futurity is now being held virtually. All information was sent to exhibitors regarding the modifications to the contest. - Other Important notes/Frequently Asked Questions:
- We will have approximately 6 food vendors on grounds to serve our livestock exhibitors throughout the show.
- There will also be tack vendors set-up throughout the event. There will be no other vendors on grounds.
- If you are not feeling well, do not attend the event. Furthermore, if you have been exposed to COVID-19, please follow all CDC guidelines regarding quarantining.
- Heifer Show: If you have heifers in both waves and cannot make it home to take animals back between waves, they will be allowed in tie outs. For Example, during Wave 1- only Wave 1 heifers will be allowed in the barn, including for washing, but Wave 2 heifers will be allowed in tie-outs. Friday morning by 9 a.m.-ALL heifers must be out of the barn and in tie outs. ALL TACK MUST BE OUT OF THE BARN AS WELL. Wave 2 Heifers will check-in Saturday morning at the stalling barn, and only Wave 2 heifers will be allowed in the barn. We will have an outside wash area. Tie-Outs will be handled on arrival-NO RESERVATIONS.
- Goat exhibitors returning for the market lamb show will be asked to remove all tack from the barn.
- Clarification: Blocking tables, blowers, and clippers will be allowed for the Wether Doe & Dam Shows ONLY.
- Ag Mechanics: Lunch will be provided for contestants on Show Day- Friday.



As we are still in a year of unknowns the District 10 office is working towards hosting as many events in person as possible. Below is a list of things that all contests will need to implement to ensure a safe environment for everyone involved. By doing some of the items listed below, **that may mean we have longer days than normal**, however, this is a sacrifice participants must be willing to make in order to provide the youth with an opportunity to compete in the safest environment possible. Remember, it is only a few days that we will need to work some longer hours to make it happen.

To host primary aspects of Texas 4-H Roundup in 2021, the Texas 4-H Youth Development program has made the decision that we will not be able to offer Intermediate contest opportunities this year. While this was a tough decision to make, we felt that because of the limitations regarding facilities and capacity due to Covid-19 social distancing restrictions, we needed to focus our efforts on opportunities for our Senior level (9th – 12th grade) 4-H members.

- <u>Masks will be required to be worn while at the event</u>. This includes even when outside where 6 feet of physical distancing is difficult to maintain.
- <u>Expect our contest days to be longer</u> as we work to spread out the number of youth together in one location at a time. We anticipate added heats for larger contest.
