COVID-19 Update from Bexar 4-H

Howdy 4-H Family,

As I'm sure you're all aware, our nation and state are currently navigating difficult waters regarding the spread of COVID-19 (https://texashelp.tamu.edu/coronavirus-information-resources/). We are taking guidance at this time from our agency, local government, and federal government on how best to advise our groups to mitigate the probabilities of infection and further spread of the virus. **Please read the following recommendations regarding public gatherings/social distancing, and best hygiene practices.** We know you all have been made aware of this information, but we'd like to emphasize the importance of these practices so we can hopefully return to a normal state of operation in the near future.

1. The following actions are being taken regarding educational programs and face to face meetings:

- a. All AgriLife face-to-face meetings have been cancelled at this time. This status will be reviewed based on the statewide public health disaster declaration made by the Governor.
- b. Currently, we are implementing a telecommuting solution to minimize as much person to person contact as possible. We can be reached during normal office hours at 210-631-0400. *We will still conduct office visits via appointments. Masks are currently still required to enter the building.

 CURRENT POLICY ON 4-H CLUB MEETINGS: Regular Face-to-Face meetings can resume. Meeting Guidelines/Checklist for Club Managers must be adhered to, and a WAIVER for participating members is highly encouraged to keep on file. We know this is an unprecedented situation, please be sure to communicate with the County Extension Office if you have questions regarding the new Guidelines/Procedures.

2. The following CDC information relates to how COVID-19 is spread:

- The virus is thought to spread mainly from person-to-person.
 - Between people who are in close contact with one another (within about 6 feet).
 - o Through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs or sneezes.

Some spread might be possible before people show symptoms; there have been reports of this occurring with this new coronavirus, but this is not thought to be the main way the virus spreads.

• Spread from contact with contaminated surfaces or objects:

It may be possible that a person can get COVID-19 by touching a surface or object that has the virus on it and then touching their own mouth, nose, or possibly their eyes, but this is not thought to be the main way the virus spreads.

3. The following CDC information relates to how to mitigate infection of COVID-19:

CDC always recommends everyday preventive actions to help prevent the spread of respiratory diseases, including:

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick and stay home if you are feeling sick.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol. Always wash hands with soap and water if hands are visibly dirty.

4-H Clubs may resume meeting. Due to many challenges we are asking each and every ONE OF YOU to help us maintain a safe and healthy environment for all! We have some updated guidelines below for conducting adult and 4-H meetings, programs, and events. As we look into the new 4-H year, we hope this resource will be helpful in determining the steps you need to take or not take to put a meeting, program or event together. Additionally, we have also included a **COVID-19 Screening Letter and Waiver Form** for your use with members. We do NOT require that you have a waiver form for every club meeting, however when members sign it at each meeting, they must acknowledge that they are agreeing to the previously signed WAIVER FORM. However, if you are holding a non-club meeting (separate project meeting, special event/training) you must acquire your own copy of the Screening Letter/Waiver. Again, we wish everyone a safe, healthy and successful year!



- Sample Bylaws (Word Doc): The sample bylaws are developed to serve as a guide for clubs/groups to use in bylaw development and/or revision. Chartered clubs/groups have flexibility with their bylaws; however, the items in bold in the sample set are required to be in the all bylaws. When you review the sample bylaws, you will notice LESS bolded/required items. This does not mean you have to change your bylaws, as long as they meet the minimum requirements, which they should if they were in compliance last year. Club/group bylaws may also not conflict with the Texas 4-H Rules and Guidelines and/or the charter agreement.
- 2020-2021 Financial Review Form: Will not apply to you since you do not have a bank account at this time.
- Charter Worksheet for Club/Group Managers to complete and use to fill out information in 4-H CONNECT This form is simply a worksheet and **should not be uploaded**.
- 4-H CONNECT Chartering Instructional Video: Shows step-by-step instructions on how to charter.
- Instructions on how to check the status of your charter after submission.

<u>Lego Mindstorm EV3 being DISCONTINUED – June 30, 2021</u>

<u>Information:</u> Lego has officially declared the discontinuation of the Mindstorm EV3 kit. What does this mean for Texas 4-H?

- If you want to purchase an EV3 kit or spare parts, I recommend you do that ASAP. U.S. sales will continue until June 30, 2021, depending on stock availability.
- We will continue to use EV3 kits in our 4-H contests for years to come. If you already have EV3 kits, no worries. Keep using those.
- We will evaluate the newer Lego robot kits and update everyone once any decisions or rule changes to our 4-H contests have been made.
- This WILL NOT impact this year's Robotics Challenge at Texas 4-H Roundup. We will proceed with the current published rules for Roundup 2020-21.
- At some point, this will likely impact future AgRobotics contests held at major stock shows. Watch for any equipment rule changes when those are published by each respective show next season. We will likely continue with EV3's at those contests for a number of years, but may also add the newer kits.

- The Texas 4-H Roundup Registration information is now posted in our <u>2021 Roundup Registration Packet</u>
- This year as part of registration, we will be requiring a signed Health Statement in <u>4HOnline</u> (Click <u>HERE</u> for instructions on how to register for an event). Before you submit registrations, be sure this document has been properly signed by a parent/guardian. We will also require that members upload a signed copy of the HSS Health & Safety Statement. <u>Download HSS (Health Safety Statement)</u> <u>Required for Online Registration</u>
- This year **ONLY YOUTH** will be required to register for Texas 4-H Roundup. However, **all youth must be accompanied by an adult.**
- Since this year's event will primarily focused on contest, youth will <u>check in and check out</u> each day from their contest location. Upon check out, they will be in the care of their parent/guardian or chaperone.



<u>COVID-19 Related CHANGES -</u> We have created a document titled <u>Expectations 2021 Texas 4-H Roundup</u> which has been posted to our Texas 4-H Roundup webpage at https://texas4-h.tamu.edu/events/roundup/

To host primary aspects of Texas 4-H Roundup in 2021, the Texas 4-H Youth Development program has made the decision that we will not be able to offer Intermediate contest opportunities this year. While this was a tough decision to make, we felt that because of the limitations regarding facilities and capacity due to Covid-19 social distancing restrictions, we needed to focus our efforts on opportunities for our Senior level (9th – 12th grade) 4-H members.

- <u>Masks will be required to be worn while at the event</u>. This includes even when outside where 6 feet of physical distancing is difficult to maintain.
- <u>Expect our contest days to be longer</u> as we work to spread out the number of youth together in one location at a time. We anticipate added heats for larger contest.
- At this time, no adjustments have been made to the contest dates as posted in August under the Schedule of Events. Our goal is to keep the contest dates the same, but should there need to be a change, we will communicate that asap. 4-H members can still only compete in one contest per day.
- Expect only contestants and contest officials to be allowed in the contest areas, no spectators.
- At this time will not be hosting a traditional assembly. We are working on ways to virtually recognize our 4-H members for their successes during the week.
- <u>Post assembly activities such as the kick-off event, dance and concert are not scheduled at this time.</u> We are working with city officials regarding activities which would be hosted by local venues for our 4-H members (limited capacity).
