This training and certification will cover a leader in the Hunting Project and is not a substitute for any 4-H Shooting Sports discipline training/certification. Participants in the training will also be certified as Texas Parks and Wildlife Department Hunter Education Instructors. This certification will allow them access to a great set of free teaching resources and the ability to certify their 4-H members in Hunter Education anytime during the year. - There are two steps in registering for the Dairy Judging, Horse Judging, and the Consumer Decision Making Contests. Since our District contest will be held in conjunction with the SALE contests, counties will need to register **twice** as outlined below.
- 1. Complete San Antonio Stock Show registration through County Extension Office by December 1, 2021.

 Teams MUST be registered for the SALE contest in order to participate in the District 10 contest. If you do not complete this step you cannot participate in the respective District 10 4-H contest. Counties may set an earlier deadline for entry so be sure and promote the County Deadline for entry for SALE. When coaches/teams come to the actual contest and complete the entry form for SALE, each child's social security number is REQUIRED!!!

<u>COUNTY RULES:</u> Our County deadline for photos will be on: March 14, 2022. We will have an online system (like last year for photo uploads). The new theme for this year is "My Hometown". The description is outlined within the rules. Remaining the same as in years past, members may still only enter 1 photo per category, max 15 photos.

Also, photos qualify directly <u>from county to state</u> for this contest. District contests have no bearing on qualifying for the state contest. Senior members (grades 9-12th) must place first at the COUNTY level to compete at state. State level participants will register and pay for entries on 4HOnline and then upload their photos on Submittable, which is the platform we use to manage the judging process.

<u>DISTRICT RULES:</u> District 10 4-H will also host a photography contest. Photos must be uploaded on 4HOnline (limit 3).
