



On behalf of the hosting Texas 4-H STEM Ambassadors, we are excited to announce that at long last Texas 4-H is going back to NASA's Johnson Space Center. This is an overnight "camping" experience held at the space center that will include hands-on STEM activities, an astronaut guest speaker, a tram tour of rocket park, and free roam of the museum's exhibits. It promises to be a great time for all space enthusiasts! **Event Dates:** March 5-6, 2022



Registration Dates: February 1-15, 2022 on 4-H Online. All youth & adult participants must register!

Who can attend: Texas 4-H members (Jr, Int, and Sr ages) and screened adults. All members must be accompanied by a parent/guardian. Saturday Check-in Time: 5-6 PM sharp & Sunday End Time: Will vary based on your own preference/needs.

What to Expect: Staff led STEM activities, astronaut guest speaker, explore the center's exhibits, and tram tour of rocket park.

<u>SPACE CENTER HOUSTON OVERNIGHT EXPERIENCE FAQ</u> – this page provides many more details about the overnight experience.

**Forms:** All participants will need to download, review, and bring signed copies of all required forms. Required forms will be available in the downloadable files section of the 4HOnline registration process. If you are chaperoning someone else's child and he/she is taking any kind of medication, the chaperone is advised to follow best practices outlined in the <u>Procedures for Handling Medications</u> document. Other forms that chaperones may need pertaining to medicines can be found on our <u>Programs for Minors Page</u>.

Meals: Saturday supper and Sunday breakfast will be provided and is included in the registration fee.

**Chaperones:** Due to the unique sleeping arrangements, all 4-H members must be accompanied by a parent/guardian. The 4-H program will not be providing any chaperones; therefore, youth are not allowed to be dropped off without a parent/guardian. All adults must register on 4HOnline. Please note, it could take up to 2 weeks to get background screening completed, so plan to re-enroll quickly if you have not already done so. When tent camping, only family units may sleep in the same tent.

#### **Sleeping Arrangements**

There will be two different options for sleeping arrangements. Again, more specific details can be found in the linked FAQ.

- 1. Indoor Lodging (inside the museum)
  - Participants will have assigned locations inside the center, which will be outlined during the event.
  - Indoor setup will take place towards the end of the evening. Please leave your bedding materials inside the car until the end of the night.
  - What to bring is outlined in the FAQ.
  - The Space Center's lead instructor will direct you to your assigned location the night of the event, after the center closes.
- 2. Outdoor Lodging
  - You may choose to sleep outside in a tent underneath their SpaceX Falcon 9 rocket that has flown to space twice or under the historic shuttle carrier aircraft that ferried space shuttles 223 times.
  - Please be aware that if you decide on outdoor sleeping you will be setting up your tent immediately after check-in NOT at the end of the night. (the 5-6 PM time period).
  - If you choose this option, you must bring your own tent as well as necessary bedding. Tent sizes and other details are outlined in the FAQ.
  - We recommend that if you are planning to sleep outdoors, that you get there closer to 5:00 pm to ensure you have enough time to pitch your tent.
  - No indoor or outdoor cooking allowed.

**COVID Guidelines/Protocol:** We will adhere and follow the guidelines of Space Center Houston and Texas 4-H/AgriLife Extension. We will provide the most up-to-date guidelines via email about a week ahead of the event. All participants will be required to submit a Covid Screening form at check-in.

**Registration Status:** Please note that all registrations will remain as "Pending" at the state level until the week of the event. This will ensure we can delete registrations without charge if the situation arises where we have to cancel the event due to Covid or other unforeseen circumstances.

**Recognition Process (NEW):** Honorees will be presented their awards locally through surprise celebration events and signs that award recipients can place in their front yards. Nominators will need to plan to take high quality videos and photos from the surprise award presentation and send them to Laura Huebinger (<u>lhuebinger@ag.tamu.edu</u>) and Callie Cline (<u>callie.cline@ag.tamu.edu</u>) so that they may be used to share through the state-wide recognition efforts.

**Roundup Reception:** During Texas 4-H Roundup, a casual, come-and-go celebration reception will be held for our award winners who are attending Texas 4-H Roundup, their families, and their County Extension Agents. It will be on **Tuesday, June 7, 2022** in the downtown Bryan area prior to the assembly for that evening's recognition. Award winners are not required to attend the reception to be honored or to receive their plaque. We hope to encourage more nominations by no longer having a formal luncheon.

**NEW APPLICATION!** All nominations will include a 1–2-page (750-1500 words) narrative description of why the nominee should be considered for the award. Read the award description before preparing the narrative to ensure it contains all the needed information. Feel free to include any quotes from members or volunteers that were influenced by the nominee.

- You will need the following information before completing the nomination form:
  - Name of award nominee
  - Phonetic spelling of nominee's name
  - Mailing address, phone number, and email address of nominee
  - Photo of nominee. (See notes below about photo.)
  - County Extension Agent's email to receive a copy of the nomination
  - Nominator's name, county, mail address, phone number, and email address
  - 75–100-word description written in third person to be used a script for award presentation
  - 1-2-page (750-1500 words) nomination narrative. It is suggested to use a word processing program to write, edit, and review the award descriptions prior to accessing the online nomination system. After all information has been written and proofed, copy and paste text into the online form.

**PRIOR HONOREES** A list of prior award winners is attached and can be found <u>HERE</u>. Please review this list to ensure the person you are nominating has not been honored with the award previously. An award can only be presented one-time to an individual and/or supporter.

## EPA's "Companies Crushing Pollution" Video Challenge

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has launched the "Companies Crushing Pollution" Video Challenge. EPA will award a total of \$50,000 in prize money through the video challenge. The Challenge invites high school and college students and others including people who live near industrial facilities to create videos illustrating how businesses in the U.S. are reducing toxic chemical releases through innovative pollution prevention (P2) practices, and by having a positive impact on the environment and communities. Participants have a chance to win up to \$5,000. All videos must be submitted by March 1, 2022. EPA will award a total of \$50,000 in prize money to multiple participants. 
