

Texas 4-H State Roundup – June 6-9th Registration - DEADLINE May 12th

As a reminder, Texas 4-H Roundup is a Senior level 4-H event only. There are no contest or workshop opportunities for Intermediate youth. Contests are open for only those who advanced to state at the district level. If your child qualified for a contest, you were notified by email. Workshops and invitational contests are open to all seniors. You are responsible for registering your child at 4HOnline before May 12th. You will be responsible for any transportation, meals and hotel accommodations your family will require for this event.

The 2022 Texas 4-H Roundup Registration packet has been posted at https://texas4-h.tamu.edu/events/roundup/. To find out more with this video click HERE. Registration opened on 4HOnline on May 1st. There will be no late registration. All registration must be complete by May 12th. Everyone will be required to upload the following forms with their registration:

Texas State 4-H Round-up Photography Judging Contest - June 6TH

At Texas State 4-H Roundup this year, we will hold the photography judging contest on June 6, 2022 and run the contest like it has been in the past. Location and start time will be released in May as part of the official schedule. Youth will still judge 8 classes and only place those classes or answer questions about them. We will not do a reasons contest for the official placings of the photography judging contest.

WE ARE ADDING ORAL REASONS TO THE PHOTOGRAPHY JUDGING CONTEST AT TEXAS STATE 4-H ROUNDUP. THE REASONS SCORES WILL NOT BE PART OF THE OFFICIAL CONTEST FOR OFFICIAL PLACINGS THIS YEAR. PLEASE READ BELOW:

Immediately after the official contest has concluded, we will hold an oral reasons clinic for all participants, agents, and families to attend. We expect and encourage all who participate in the judging contest to participate in the clinic as next year's Texas State 4-H Roundup contest WILL take into account reasons scores for the overall placings.

The clinic will introduce the new portion of the contest and offer an opportunity to practice at the end of the clinic. We will discuss how the oral reasons portion will work in the future and give guidance on how to properly present a set of Photography Judging oral reasons. We will have a small practice contest at the end of the clinic for the youth to put that new knowledge to the test.

IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS:

- 1. <u>Bexar County Council Officer Responsibilities</u>: Outlines what each officer is responsible for on the Council so members can prepare for their campaign speech and select which positions you'd like to run for.
- 2. <u>By Laws</u> (Operating for 2022): Please review our standing By Laws for Council so members are aware of the rules on eligibility.
- 3. <u>County Council Application 22-23</u>: Interested 4-H members must turn in this application PRIOR to the election night so that you can be approved by the office before elections.

All members who plan to run for office will need to complete ONE campaign speech (3-5 mins MAX) in which you outline: why you want to serve on Council, what experiences qualify you for the position(s) you are seeking on Council, and any ideas you would like to share. You are welcome to bring a campaign poster to the meeting to display as well. Please do not bring incentives/giveaways for your campaign. All campaign materials should be for viewing and not distribution. You may NOT run on behalf of another member, and all interested members should be PHYSICALLY present to run, no virtual speeches. Club Chartering Process & Instructions - DEADLINE June 21, 2022

Charters should be due to the Bexar County 4-H Office

ALL 4-H Clubs Must Have:

- **Charter Application Worksheet** for Club/Group Managers to complete and use to fill out information in 4HOnline This form is simply a worksheet and **should not be uploaded** as part of the chartering process.
- 2022-2023 Charter Agreement (Must be signed by CEA/CED)
- Bylaws: The sample bylaws are developed to serve as a guide for clubs/groups to use in bylaw development and/or revision. Chartered clubs/groups have flexibility with their bylaws; however, the items in bold in the sample set are required to be in all bylaws. When you review the sample bylaws, you will notice fewer bolded/required items. This does not mean you have to change your bylaws, as long as they meet the minimum requirements, which they should if they were in compliance last year. Club/group bylaws may also not conflict with the Texas 4-H Rules and Guidelines and/or the charter agreement.

ONLY CLUBS with a 4-H BANK ACCOUNT MUST HAVE:

- 2021-2022 Financial Review Form & Asset List
- One Copy of Previous Bank Statement for each account: Bank statements uploaded as part of the chartering packet should not include copies of canceled checks. This is for security of the club/group account(s).

Some things to be aware of: The Club name MUST match what we have file in our current system to a TEE. If they alter the name/abbreviate or change up their name in any of the documents above, it will be rejected. Please double, and triple check that the signatures of reviewers on the financial review form are NOT club members of the club. They must be outside parties who sign that form.




