#### Club Chartering Process & Instructions – (TURN IN ASAP)

ALL 4-H Clubs Must Have:

- **Charter Application Worksheet** for Club/Group Managers to complete and use to fill out information in 4HOnline This form is simply a worksheet and **should not be uploaded** as part of the chartering process.
- 2022-2023 Charter Agreement (Must be signed by CEA/CED)
- Bylaws: The sample bylaws are developed to serve as a guide for clubs/groups to use in bylaw development and/or revision. Chartered clubs/groups have flexibility with their bylaws; however, the items in bold in the sample set are required to be in all bylaws. When you review the sample bylaws, you will notice fewer bolded/required items. This does not mean you have to change your bylaws, as long as they meet the minimum requirements, which they should if they were in compliance last year. Club/group bylaws may also not conflict with the Texas 4-H Rules and Guidelines and/or the charter agreement.

ONLY CLUBS with a 4-H BANK ACCOUNT MUST HAVE:

- 2021-2022 Financial Review Form & Asset List
- One Copy of Previous Bank Statement for each account: Bank statements uploaded as part of the chartering packet should not include copies of canceled checks. This is for security of the club/group account(s).

Some things to be aware of: The Club name MUST match what we have file in our current system to a TEE. If they alter the name/abbreviate or change up their name in any of the documents above, it will be rejected. Please double, and triple check that the signatures of reviewers on the financial review form are NOT club members of the club. They must be outside parties who sign that form.

## 2023 Walter Gerlach Livestock Show and Sale - January 20th - 28th (RULEBOOK)

Eligibility Rules (see Rule 15 of rulebook):

- Exhibitors must be an active member of an "invited" FFA Chapter or 4H Club ( ASTA FFA, Helotes 4H LSO, LSP, and Unlimited Clubs, and Leon Springs 4H ) <u>and</u> must reside in the Northside ISD or legally attend a NISD school during the entire feeding period and throughout the duration of the show. (See Rule 12 for animal eligibility).
- Exhibitor must attend an accredited private, home school, or public elementary or secondary school and has not yet graduated from high school (in the Northside school district boundaries)
- Exhibitor must personally feed and care for his/her animal for the entire duration of the feeding and fitting period.
- An exhibitor attending the NISD Alternative Center may not participate.
- An exhibitor who is a 5th year high school student may not participate.
- All exhibitors must be between the ages of 9 and 19 on August 31, 2022 or may be 8 years old and in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade on August 31, 2022.
- Exhibitors who are ineligible under Texas Education Code 33.081 "No Pass, No Play" are not allowed to participate in any WGLS activity, including the showing of a project and/or auction. Any project owned by an ineligible exhibitor is also ineligible for competition and auction. This includes Ag Mechanics entries.

## 2022 District 12 4-H Shooting Sports Coach's Certification Training – September 24<sup>th</sup> - 25<sup>th</sup> (FLYER)

The next District 12 4-H Shooting Sports Coach's Certification training has been scheduled for **September 24-25**, **2022**, at the Frio County Office of Texas A&M AgriLife Extension in Pearsall, Texas. This event is open to any/all <u>registered and screened 4-H volunteers</u> (age 21 and older) wishing to become certified to lead a 4-H shooting sports program in one of the following four disciplines: **Rifle, Pistol, Shotgun**, or **Archery**. **This training is open statewide**. There are three <u>opportunities</u> for attending this training with specific registration fees for each.

## Archery 101 – October 1st (FLYER)

Whether you are an experienced archer or just picking up a bow, this event has something for you.
