Only those users who are new or are moving to the next grade level course (junior: 3-5th grade, intermediate: 6-8th, senior: 9-12th) are required to take Quality Counts this year.

2025 Major Show Lamb/Goat Validation Tag Order (FORM) - DEADLINE August 9th

All lambs/goats to be shown at the 2025 Major Stock Shows must be validated. Cost will be \$18.00 per head by Friday, August 9, 2024. The price after August 9th will be \$35.00 per head. Make checks payable to Bexar 4-H Fund.

2025 Major Show Heifer Validation Tag Order (FORM) – DEADLINE August 9th

All heifers to be shown at the county and major livestock shows must be state-validated. Cost will be \$27.00 per head. If you are showing through Bexar County 4-H, please return this form and fees to the Bexar County Extension Office at 3355 Cherry Ridge Dr. Suite 212 San Antonio, TX 78230 by Friday, August 9th. Make checks payable to Bexar 4-H Fund. Validation will take place Saturday, October 26 from 9:00 am - 11:00 am at East Central High School.

2025 Major Show Swine Validation Tag Order – DEADLINE September 6th

All swine to be shown at the county and major livestock shows must be validated. The updated form coming soon.

2025 Major Show Broiler Order (FORM) – DEADLINE September 6th

Bexar County Junior Livestock Show and San Antonio, Houston, and Rodeo Austin broiler orders are due to the Extension office by Friday, September 6th, 2024. A minimum of 25 and a maximum of 75 poults may be ordered per exhibitor/family. Each exhibitor MAY order an individual set of birds (up to 75) OR siblings within the same household may order and share a set of birds (up to 75). The cost is \$1.55 per chick.

4-H STEM Curriculum: Sustainable Polymers: Confronting the Plastic Crisis (FLYER)

Introducing the new 4-H STEM Curriculum for Grades 9-12: Sustainable Polymers: Confronting the Plastic Crisis. Engaging youth to learn about and help mitigate negative environmental impacts of plastic waste.

CLOVER by 4-H x Google Activities (ACTIVITY)

CLOVER by 4-H recently released three new activities, designed by the University of Georgia Extension and brought to you by Google, focused on educating youth about computer science with the help of Scratch. Scratch is a visual programming language designed to teach programming concepts fun and intuitively by allowing users to create animations, games, and interactive stories.

- Introducing Commands an introduction to basic coding and using commands in Scratch. Explore the simple commands of "move" and "turn" by coding a graphic to complete a maze.
- Jumping Sprite Introducing Functions create a simple jumping game in Scratch to explore how functions are used.
- "Say My Name" Introducing Variables an introduction to coding with variables in Scratch. During this activity, you will tell a story using code.

2024 – 2025 Texas 4-H Chartering Process – DEADLINE June 30th

The 2024-2025 chartering process for existing clubs/groups as well as guidelines for the establishment of new 4-H clubs in Texas 4-H and under the Texas 4-H, Inc. organization is officially open. These documents and other resources are available online at https://texas4-h.tamu.edu/management/. June 30, 2024, is the deadline to submit 4-H club/group charter applications in order for the application to be reviewed for approval for an August 15 club activation. Items to note include:

- Texas 4-H Chartering Instructions Please note the timeline and important deadlines!
- <u>2024-2025 Charter Agreement</u> -- <u>Please note the changes to the Charter Agreement for 2024-2025!</u> As before, signatures are required, but the document must also be initialed where indicated.
- <u>Sample Bylaws:</u> The sample bylaws are developed to serve as a guide for clubs/groups to use in bylaw development and/or revision. Chartered clubs/groups have flexibility with their bylaws; however, the items in bold in the sample set are required to be in all bylaws. <u>Club/group bylaws should not conflict with the Texas 4-H Rules and Guidelines and/or the newly revised Charter Agreement.</u>
- 2023 2024 Financial Review Form: Bank statements uploaded as part of the chartering packet should not include copies of canceled checks and/or deposit slips. This is for the security of the club/group account(s). Please note that a checkbox has been added to the financial review form indicating that the Extension Agent certifies that all signers on the bank account are currently enrolled 4-H adult volunteer leaders. Also, please note that the name on a 4-H club's bank account should match the name of the 4-H club/group as well as the name on the EIN assignment letter. In order to avoid the application being sent back for corrections, please ensure that the financial review form is completed in its entirety.
- <u>Charter Application Worksheet</u> for Club/Group Managers to complete and use to fill out information in 4HOnline - This form is simply a worksheet and <u>should not be uploaded</u> as part of the chartering process.
- <u>Disbandment Form</u> Included for any club that will be disbanding. Upon closure of the club, please provide the completed form to the Texas 4-H Office.
