4-H Livestock, Equine and Poultry Ambassador – DEADLINE April 15th

The Texas 4-H Ambassador Program strives to provide high school aged 4-H members the opportunity to develop and practice advanced leadership skills related to mentoring other youth, and to become advocates for animal agriculture. **Selection Criteria:**

- Senior level (grades 9-12 in fall 2025) 4-H youth that have exhibited a superior level of ambition regarding his/her livestock/equine/poultry projects
- Students with a profound interest in animal/equine/poultry science, animal production and advocacy
- Students have shown advanced leadership qualities and a willingness to help others
- Top 25% class rank preferred

2025 Texas 4-H Horse Validation (INFO) (VIDEO) (WALK-THROUGH) - DEADLINE April 15th

ALL horses must be validated/re-validated each year. There is no limit to the number of horses that can be validated. You are encouraged to validate all horses that may possibly be shown at district and/or state shows. Only state validated horses can be substituted if a validated horse becomes unusable due to lameness, sickness, etc. The family can submit payment of \$10.00 per horse (\$20.00 after April 15th, or \$250 from May 1st to May 5th), in the form of a **credit card ONLY**.

- o From March 1 April 15, the validation cost for each horse is \$10.00. The \$10.00 cost is only guaranteed if animal validation is approved by the county office by the April 15th deadline and the payment is processed.
- From April 16 May 1, the validation cost for each horse is \$20.00. The \$20.00 cost is only guaranteed if animal validation is approved by the county office by the May 1st deadline and the payment is processed.
- Each validation must include front view, right side view, and left side view images. The entire horse should be included in the photo and markings should be clearly visible.
- If the horse is registered, a copy of the registration papers must be uploaded. These papers must list the 4-Her, sibling, parent, stepparent, grandparent or legal guardian as the current owner. If the ownership is in the process of being transferred, please list "pending" in the registration number area. Once the updated registration papers have been received, please email me a copy of the new papers and I will add it to the validation online.
- Lease horses are eligible to be validated and shown at District and State 4-H Horse Shows. An official Texas 4-H Horse Lease Agreement must be signed by the exhibitor, horse owner, and supervising CEA. The lease period must include, at minimum, May 1st to August 31st of the current 4-H year. The lease agreement form can be found at https://texasyouthlivestock.com/horse-validation/ and must be uploaded in 4-H Online at the time of validation.
- Image uploads in 4-H Online must be in the form of a .jpg, .gif or .png file.
- **Families should validate each horse only once.** Once the horse is validated, any sibling within that family in 4-H Online is eligible to show the horse at their district show and/or the State 4-H Horse Show.
- Youth validating a futurity horse must be at least 12 years of age (as of Sept. 1, 2024) and at least in 6th grade.
- The family will receive an automated message from 4-H Online when the CEA has approved the horse at the county level. **This approval does NOT guarantee eligibility**. After it is approved at the county level, the validation will then be reviewed at the state level. The family will be notified by June 1st if there are any issues with the validation at the state level.
 - We will begin to review validations at the state level on March 1st and will be working closely with families and agents to fix errors as quickly as possible prior to the deadline.

NATURAL RESOURCES/SHOOTING SPORTS

2025 4-H Outdoor Challenge (INFORMATION) - DEADLINE May 15th

The 4-H Outdoor Challenge contest consists of 10 events where teams compete to earn points for overall high point position. A team consists of exactly 2 members within the same age division and gender class. Teams compete in all 10 events during one weekend of competition. Participants will learn and practice various outdoor education activities from fishing and shooting to camping and biologist skills.

Helotes 3D Archery Fun Shoot (FLYER) (REGISTRATION)

The Helotes 4-H Wildlife Project is inviting shooters of all ages and experience levels to come enjoy the 5th annual 3D Archery Shoot. Fees to participate are \$20 for youth and \$30 for adults. Registration price includes a lunch meal deal. Participants do not need to be in 4-H to shoot. The event will be held on 4/12/25 at the Helotes Ag Youth Ranch just north of Rio Medina.

<u>Texas 4-H Landscape Design Challenge (RSVP) (FLYER)</u>

The Texas 4-H Landscape Design Challenge is hosted by the Horticulture Department at Texas A&M University during the week of Texas 4-H Roundup. This contest enhances landscape design knowledge, promotes professionalism in landscape design presentation, provides real-life interaction between customers and landscape professionals with youth, and provides exposure to A&M horticulture degrees and other opportunities. There will be an informational meeting regarding the landscape challenge for all who are interested on April 3rd at 2 PM. The contest will be held on June 2nd.

2025 4-H Beekeeping Essay Contest (INFORMATION) - DEADLINE April 16th

It's time to submit entries for the 2025 4-H Beekeeping Essay contest! This year's topic, as chosen by the Foundation for the Preservation of Honeybees, Inc., is "The Importance of Youth in Beekeeping: How 4-H Members Can Make a Difference!" Texas 4-H Water Ambassador Program (APPLICATION) – DEADLINE May 1st

The Texas 4-H Water Ambassadors Program provides high school youth an opportunity to gain advanced knowledge and develop leadership skills related to the science, technology, engineering, and management of water in Texas. By connecting with water professionals, water ambassadors gain exposure and recognition as youth leaders, learn about scholarship and internship opportunities, and explore the diverse career paths in the water industry.

Selection Criteria:

- Senior level 4-H youth (grades 9-12 in fall 2026)
- Students with a genuine interest in water and natural resources

Application Process:

- Student will complete the online application and submit two letters of recommendation
- CEA will be notified of any youth applying within their county
- Applications are reviewed and up to 30 youth are selected
- CEA will be notified of any youth selected within their county

Requirements:

- Participate in the Tier I 4-H2O Leadership Academy (tour) June 8-14
- Commit to completing a minimum of 40 hours of education/service by June 30, 2026
- Complete monthly assignments
- Make a good faith effort to attend Spring/Fall retreats and participate in monthly Zoom seminars
- Pay the \$300 participation fee

SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING AND MATHEMATICS

2024 - 2025 State Photography Contest (INFORMATION) - DEADLINE April 15th

The rules for the 2024-2025 state contest are also attached. For those who may be new to Extension, the state 4-H photography contest is a senior-only qualifying contest where photos qualify directly from COUNTY to STATE. We have added 3 new categories this year, as such each county may now submit a maximum of 18 total photos (1 photo per category). As stated in the rules, counties are highly encouraged to have some type of selection process in place to determine which photos are eligible. Key points:

- Qualify from county level (district contests have no bearing on qualifications)
- Open to senior age division only
- 18 categories (includes a new "Patriotic" theme for this year)
- Entry timeline is April 1-15
- No late entries accepted
