2025 – 2026 Texas 4-H Enrollment Guides and Instructions (GUIDES)

The new 4-H year is just around the corner, and it's time for members and families to re-enroll in 4HOnline to participate in local clubs, contests, and events. If you have any questions, contact Kennedy at 210-631-0400. **Access 4HOnline here:** https://v2.4honline.com/#/user/sign-in

Note: 4-H members entering the 3rd grade should wait until September 1, 2025, to enroll to ensure they are assessed the correct fees.

• Youth Enrollment Fee - \$25

Youth may participate in 4-H from **September 1 of 3rd grade** through **August 31 after completing 12th grade**, with these age requirements:

- Minimum Age: 8 years old as of September 1, 2025, and entering 3rd grade.
- Maximum Age: 18 years old as of September 1, 2025
- Clover Enrollment Fee \$10

For youth at least 5 years old who are eligible to enroll in Kindergarten on September 1 of the current year **and** have **not** started 3rd grade as of September 1.

• Adult Enrollment Fee - \$10

For adults age 18 or older who are no longer enrolled in school as of September 1.

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Quality Counts Update! (INSTRUCTIONS) (ENROLLMENT)

As we kick off another school year, we're excited to see youth back in action, at events, and in the barn. Quality Counts are open and ready for any youth who need to take the course for the first time or renew their verification. Quick Reminder: Exhibitors only need to complete the course once per grade division:

- Junior: Grades 3–5, Intermediate: Grades 6–8, Senior: Grades 9–12
- Each individual exhibitor <u>MUST</u> register with their own unique email address to receive their Quality Counts Number.
- The email and name you log in to AgriLife Learn with will be the contact information used to assign the number.
- Quality Counts are required for all major livestock show entries.
- Exhibitors must complete the course **before entry deadlines**.

2026 BCJLS Validation (INFORMATION) (WEBSITE)

To show at the Bexar County Junior Livestock Show (BCJLS), all animals must be validated with the BCJLS, the Walter Gerlach Livestock Show (WGLS), OR by the State of Texas. If an animal is state validated, it does not need a BCJLS tag. BCJLS offers validation ear tags for purchase for \$5 CASH for lambs, goats, and pigs at certain validation events. BCJLS is NOT present at every validation. A BCJLS ear tag by itself is **NOT** valid for major shows.


National 4-H Volunteer Conference (INFORMATION) (FACEBOOK)
