Quality Counts Update! (INSTRUCTIONS) (ENROLLMENT)

As we kick off another school year, we're excited to see youth back in action, at events, and in the barn. Quality Counts are open and ready for any youth who need to take the course for the first time or renew their verification. Quick Reminder: Exhibitors only need to complete the course once per grade division:

- Junior: Grades 3–5, Intermediate: Grades 6–8, Senior: Grades 9–12
- Each individual exhibitor <u>MUST</u> register with their own unique email address to receive their Quality Counts Number.
- The email and name you log in to AgriLife Learn with will be the contact information used to assign the number.
- Quality Counts are required for all major livestock show entries.
- Exhibitors must complete the course **before Major Show Entry deadlines**.

2026 Major Show Entry: November 3rd – November 7th (APPOINTMENTS) – DEADLINE November 7th Entries will be accepted at the Bexar County EFNEP Office (8844 Tradeway San Antonio, TX 78217). Appointments with Sam will be available on November 3rd from 1:30 PM – 4:30 PM and November 5th from 8:30 AM – 4:30 PM. <u>This year we will also be hosting Major Show Entry Nights at the Helotes Youth Activity Center on November 4th at 6:30 PM and the BCJLS Grounds on November 5th at 6:30 PM.</u>

- <u>ALL</u> entries (Fort Worth Stock Show, San Angelo Stock Show, Texas Elite, Rodeo Austin, Rio Grande Valley Livestock Show, Houston Livestock Show, Hill District Grandstand and San Antonio Stock Show and Rodeo) will be <u>due November 7th</u>. Any entries submitted <u>AFTER</u> November 7th will incur a \$100 fee.
- You are responsible for doing your own entries for Hill District Grandstand and San Antonio Stock Show and Rodeo online. If something changes once the premium books are released, we will let you know.
- If you are needing a San Antonio Premium Pass, please notify Kennedy Green by October 27th. They are \$500 each.
- Major Show Entry appointments, please click <u>HERE</u>.

 - o **MUST BE** an enrolled 4-H Member for the 2025 2026 year
 - o Valid Quality Counts number that is up to date for age division. (QUALITY COUNTS INFORMATION)
 - Child Social Security Number
 - Entry forms can be printed in advance and brought with you or picked up at the Bexar County EFNEP Office.
 - Breeding animals: Exhibitors are encouraged to bring registration papers.
 - o Cash or check ONLY to cover entry fee. Make checks payable to Bexar 4-H Fund

INDIVIDUAL/TEAM COMPETITIONS (INCLUDING SAN ANTONIO) – DEADLINE November 7th

- Please reference shows premium book on rules.
- 1 Team coach/parent will bring all money and forms for registration.
- ALL TEAM MEMBERS MUST BE LISTED AT THE TIME OF REGISTRATION.
- The person completing team registration will need all the required information for each team member at the time of registration.
- All competitions with team limits will be determined by county qualifying contests if necessary.

BCJLS Entries are OPEN! (ENTRY) (INSTRUCTIONS) - DEADLINE November 1st

Electronic entries for the 63rd show are open! Entries will close at 11:59 PM on Saturday, November 1st, 2025. The entry process is the same as last year. Broiler exhibitors, you must create an entry in ShoWorks for each exhibitor. The Google Form you completed to order your broiler chickens IS NOT the Show Entry Form.

2026 BCJLS Validation (INFORMATION) (WEBSITE)

To show at the Bexar County Junior Livestock Show (BCJLS), all animals must have a BCJLS, Walter Gerlach Livestock Show (WGLS), OR State Validation Tag. If an animal is state validated, it does not need a BCJLS tag. BCJLS offers validation tags for purchase for \$5 CASH for lambs, goats, and pigs at certain validation events. BCJLS is NOT present at every validation. Please visit their website above for a list of validation sites they will be offered at. A BCJLS ear tag by itself is **NOT** valid for major shows.

The new 4-H year is just around the corner, and it is time for members and families to re-enroll in 4HOnline to participate in local clubs, contests, and events. **You must reenroll each year**. If you have any questions, contact Kennedy at 210-631-0400.

- Youth Enrollment (8 18) Fee \$25 (AFTER NOVEMBER 1st PRICE WILL RISE TO \$30)
- Minimum Age: 8 years old as of September 1, 2025, and entering third grade.
- Maximum Age: 18 years old as of September 1, 2025
- Clover Enrollment Fee (5 7) \$10

For youth at least 5 years old who are eligible to enroll in Kindergarten on September 1 of the current year **and** have **not** started third grade as of September 1.

• Adult Enrollment Fee - \$10

CLUB MANAGERS! The Process of Filing an IRS 990 – DEADLINE December 19th

THE PROCESS OF FILING AN IRS 990 FORM IS REQUIRED OF EVERY 4-H CLUB/GROUP THAT HAS AN ACTIVE EIN, REGARDLESS IF THE CLUB/GROUP IS MANAGING MONEY.

Any club or group that does not have a successful filing by the December date could potentially be in jeopardy of having their EIN revoked by the IRS. Filing a club or group annual information return is accomplished by each club or group manager and treasurer working with County Extension Agents to complete and file an IRS Form 990. Form 990 is the form used by tax-exempt organizations to provide the IRS with the information required on an annual basis. There are several Form 990s that a 4-H club/group can file, depending on their financial status. The Form 990 options are:

- Form 990N (e-postcard): Gross receipts \$50,000 or less
- Form 990EZ: Gross receipts less than \$200,000 and total assets less than \$500,000 at the end of the year
- Form 990: Gross receipts exceeding \$200,000 at the end of the year

Please follow the instructions below to successfully file your club/group 990 form. As you follow the instructions, please do so with these key points in mind:

- Filing an annual information return is not dependent upon if the club has money or income for the past year. It is the official procedure to maintain a club/group EIN number and 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status. Every club with an EIN under Texas 4-H Inc. must file annually.
- If a 990-N (e-postcard) filing is rejected, the County Extension Office and/or club manager should follow the instructions to resolve the issue directly with the IRS. Texas 4-H, Inc. cannot accept failed attempt notices from the IRS online system.
- 4-H Clubs/Groups that use another entities' EIN, such as a school-based 4-H club that uses the school's EIN, must work with the school and follow their timeline and procedures for filing with the IRS.

HOW TO FILE

To electronically submit Form 990-N, Electronic Notice (e-Postcard) for Tax-Exempt Organizations Not Required to File Form 990 or Form 990-EZ, use the Form 990-N Electronic Filing System (e-Postcard).

- Form 990-N must be completed and filed electronically. There is no paper form.
- Form 990-N filers may choose to file a complete Form 990 or Form 990-EZ instead.
- Use the Form 990-N Electronic Filing System (e-Postcard) User Guide while registering and filing.
- Organizations should continue efforts to file, even if late.

While there is no penalty assessment for filing a Form 990-N late, organizations that fail to file required
Forms 990, 990-EZ or 990-N for three consecutive years will automatically lose their tax-exempt status. Revocation of the organization's tax- exempt status will happen on the filing due date of the third consecutively-missed year.

Information you will need when filing Form 990-N

Form 990-N is easy to complete. You'll need only eight items of basic information about your organization.

- 1. Employer identification number (EIN), also known as a Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN).
- 2. Tax year (2024)
- 3. Legal name (Texas 4-H) and mailing address of club
- 4. Any other names the organization uses (Club name listed on EIN verification)
- 5. Name and address of a principal officer
- 6. Web site address if the organization has one
- 7. Confirmation that the organization's annual gross receipts are \$50,000 or less
- 8. If applicable, a statement that the organization has terminated or is terminating (going out of business)
